The end of the summer term may be in sight but our learning team are thinking ahead to the next school year.

With the anniversary of the end of the First World War in November we will be launching a Remembrance session. The activity will focus on the First World War soldiers commemorated on the Cenotaph in Clifton Park; children will investigate the lives of local soldiers using photographs and newspapers from our archive collection.

We are very excited to offer a museum sleepover for schools, providing a unique opportunity to sleep in the museum galleries. During the evening children will travel back in time and discover the secret world of the Egyptians and Aztecs. The night will include refreshments, craft activities, a treasure hunt, a film screening and not forgetting breakfast in the morning. You can book weekday nights during term time and times are 7.00pm until 8am. The night is for school groups of up to 30 pupils aged 7 –11 years. Costing £25 per child (minimum group charge applies) All accompanying adults are free.

Celebrating 125 YEARS 1893-2018



This year Clifton Park Museum is celebrating 125 years of welcoming visitors. A new exhibition telling the fascinating story of the museum through our objects.

Originally built in 1783 and home to Joshua and Susanna Walker the museum was opened by the Mayor of Rotherham on 6th July 1893.
